Dan McAllister Sworn In for 4th Term as the County's Treasurer- Tax Collector

San Diego, CA... Today Dan McAllister was sworn in for his fourth term as San Diego County Treasurer-Tax Collector. The "swearing-in" ceremony took place at **10:00 am, at the County's Administration Center, located at 1600 Pacific Highway in downtown San Diego.** The oath was administered by his son, Ensign Patrick Daniel McAllister, of the US Navy, his daughter, Katie Anne McAllister, and Herb Johnson, President/CEO of the San Diego Rescue Mission.

"I am honored to be serving our San Diego County taxpayers for another four years," stated McAllister. "We have improved our service to the public but there is still much more to be done. I am proud to lead this office and I look forward to a productive and effective term."

Dan McAllister was elected San Diego County's Treasurer-Tax Collector in November 2002 and re-elected to his fourth term in June 2014 by an overwhelming 99% majority of the vote. Since assuming office, he has worked extensively to improve customer service, enhance communications and outreach initiatives, and has made numerous operational and procedural improvements. He is also a strong advocate for diversity. This is reflected in his staff, which encompasses professionals from all walks of life and backgrounds.

"My highest priorities over the next four years are to continue improving customer service, increasing the use of electronic payments and developing a smart phone APP to make it even easier for property owners to make their payments online," stated McAllister. "A thank you goes out to my team, the Board of Supervisors, to my family and to the voters of San Diego County for their continued support."

This year, McAllister estimates his office will collect more than \$5.1 billion up from \$2.6 billion when he was first elected in 2002. Last year, the office reached an incredible 99.1% collection rate, one of the highest in the State of California. In addition, this past year, the County's Investment Pool reached a record \$8.7 billion up from \$2.5 billion in 2002. The Investment Pool also received Standard & Poor's highest credit ratings for the 14th consecutive year.
